**Letters Received:** Received letter from New Hampshire Department of Natural and Cultural Resources Division of Forests and Lands regarding a variance from the provisions of RSA 227-J:9 to remove 50 percent of the basal area along 400' of Valley Rd on parcel K-4 which is the Old Schoolhouse lot belonging to the town.

Action Items Review: Completed.

**CC email**: Received results of Mason Quarry water testing for bacteria, sample taken July 6 and analyzed by Chemserve. Ecoli levels were 27, below NH swimmable limit of 88. Water testing will be done monthly throughout the summer.

## Discussions:

We discussed the bids for repairing the roof on the A-frame house on 135 Old Ashby Rd., Mason. Ann moved that we accept the quote provided by Kelco Construction LLC for \$12,100. Bob seconded. Passed unanimously.

We discussed the bids for repair of Railroad Trail wash-outs near Scripps Lane and Morse Rd, including grading, ditching, and placement of rocks to block access from Coyne Lane to the Quarry and to block access from Wilton Rd and Greenville Rd to the Valentine trail system. Liz moved that we accept the quote from KS LLC General Contracting for \$4790. Bob seconded. Passed unanimously.

We discussed the possibility of parcel A-13 for conservation.

We discussed Michelle's training on Wetland Regulation.
